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Writing Task 2 - Overview

- You are presented with a point of view, argument or problem and asked to write an essay in response
- Spend about 40 minutes on the task
- Write an essay
- Write 250 words

Writing Task 2 - Types of Questions

- Ask your opinion about something
- Ask you to discuss to different points of view
- Ask you to discuss the advantages and disadvantages of something
- Ask you to discuss the causes/problems and solutions of something

- 1. Understand the question
- 2. Plan your answer
- 3. Write an introduction
- 4. Write the main body paragraphs
- 5. Write a conclusion

1. Understand the question

Be sure you understand the question

Answer the question fully

2. Plan Your Answer

- Take 5-10 minutes to plan how you will answer
- This helps you to organize your ideas and structure your essay before you write it

3. Write an Introduction

- The introduction should tell the examiner what the rest of the essay is about and also answer the question directly
- Write a Thesis Statement

- 4. Write the main body paragraphs
- State your main points and support these with explanations and examples

Write clear topic sentences

5. Write a conclusion

 Provide a summary of what you already said in the rest of your essay.

WARNING! - Timing is Important

- Some students spend too long on Task 1 and then don't have enough time for Task 2
- You should practice writing Task 1 in 20 minutes
- If you spend too long on Task 1, you won't have enough time to answer part 2 adequately

WARNING! - Don't Show Off

 If you try to use advanced vocabulary and grammar structures, but use them incorrectly, you will actually get a lower score

It is much better to use a simpler structure you are 100% sure is correct

- Make your opinions very clear
- I believe that....
- ☐ It is agreed that...
- It is disagreed that...
- ☐ This essays agrees that....
- ☐ This essay does not agree that.....

- Paraphrase
- Use synonyms

Never memorize an answer

- Use a lot of cohesive devices
- Comparison Also, Equally, Similarly, Compared with
- Addition And, Also, Furthermore, Too
- ☐ Sequencing First, Second, Third, Next, Then, After
- Exemplification For example, For instance, Such as
- Result So, Therefore, As a result, Thus, Because
- Contrast In comparison, In contrast, Instead, Conversely
- ☐ Etc...

- Don't overuse words
- Use multiple cohesive devices

- The Examiners do not care about your opinion
- Just write the easiest opinion

Keep it simple

Just show them in a simple way that you have understood the question and you can express yourself in English. That's it.

Task 2 Sample Answer - 285 Words

In the modern world, throwing parties can be challenging for its organizers. However, there is an opinion that it can create a new society, which is more organized and cheerful. Personally, I reckon that celebrations' number should be limited in order to make a conscious society.

It is widely known that ordinary people spend the significant amount of money on the celebrations of parties, such as weddings, birthdays and graduation. Consequently, they can face with shortage of money after the celebrations. A good illustration of this is weddings in Central Asia, where citizens take loans and credits in order to celebrate parties. Furthermore, parties can lead to an unhealthy lifestyle. That is to say, not controlling your diet can lead to the deterioration of well-being. To illustrate, many party animals are suffering from diseases relating to their digestion.

On the other hand, such kinds of events can be beneficial for the individuals as well as for the society. First of all, it can create a new community.
